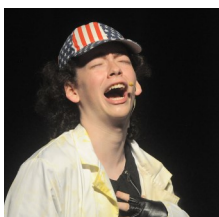
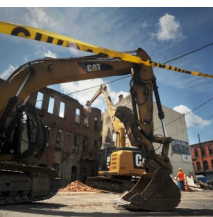
Oil Heritage Festival Schedule in Flux
