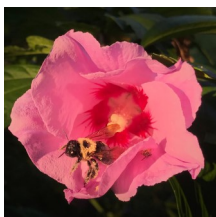
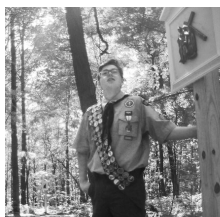


Back Porch Sports Banter
